Elizabeth Gascoigne nee Wigan

Obituary

It was with great sadness that we learned of the death in February of Dibbie, as she liked to be called. Her parents Capt and Mrs Denis Wigan came to Loudham Hall with their very young baby Elizabeth in 1919 and she maintained her close connections with the area throughout her life. During her childhood her regret was not going away to school as did her older brother Adair but she vividly remembered saving up for her bicycle so that she could cycle to the local Guide Company when she was thirteen. Loudham Hall in those days held Fetes and Ploughing Matches and as a twelve year old she could draw a furrow with horses as good as the next. She also loved to stay at Church Farm with her nanny, Mrs Gertrude Last, and help to sell the milk at the door to the people who brought their cans. This stood her in good stead later when she farmed Loudham in the 60's and 70's with her Uncle Sir Robert Adeane,. Her parents having cared for the estate for over fifty years.

Dibbie married Humphrey Gascoigne in 1936 an important wedding held in Pettistree Church. Then followed several years living away from the area during which she owned a florist's shop in Tunbridge Wells. Floral art was learned from her mother whilst growing up at Loudham.

In the late 50's Dibbie and Humphrey returned to Ashe Abbey and restored the Ashe Abbey House and dairy also allowing much archaeological work to be undertaken there.

Later although living in Wickham Market she kept close contact with Pettistree and was generous and supportive to the Church as Churchwarden, the W.I. as President, (1976-1982) and latterly the Village Hall as President.

As Ned Hogg wrote in the Church Magazine she was a fine lady in every sense of the word, kindly and caring to all, quietly generous in all sorts of ways and loved by all who knew her. She will be greatly missed and remembered by many.
